Area Poultry News

Backyard Flock Management - On January 27th, the four Area Specialized Agents for Poultry in NC started a backyard flock series. The intent is to serve poultry enthusiasts of every level across the state. From the beginner to the very experienced, the small hobby flock to the large business venture, everyone is welcome. The next meeting is scheduled for March 17th and additional ones will follow every 6-8 weeks.

The first topic of the series, Backyard Poultry Management, was presented by Dr. Kenneth Anderson of the Prestage Department of Poultry Science at NC State University. The presentation was an overview of multiple aspects of keeping backyard poultry and included topics such as; municipal ordinances, breed selection, egg production vs meat production, brooding, coop/run design, nutrition, parasites, and biosecurity. There were over 100 attendees present, representing 39 counties across NC and some from other states including Virginia, Tennessee, Florida, and even Texas.
